By Gift

By Wills and Legacies

If you would like to contribute to the work of the Pallottines through a Will or Legacy, talk to your family or your solicitor to make the necessary arrangements.

By Project Gifts

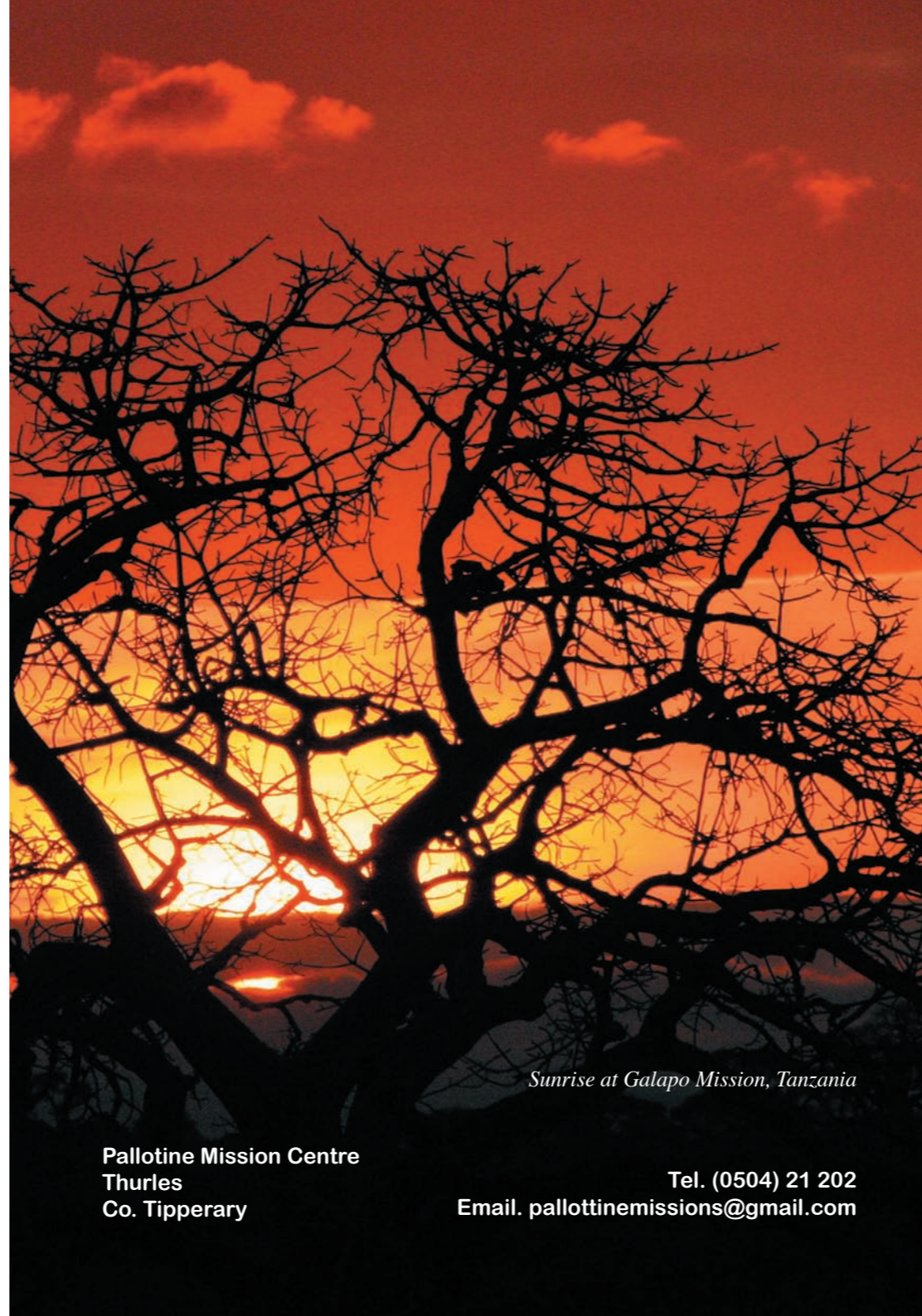
You can give a gift for a particular purpose, Education or Healthcare, for example. Your donation will then be used specifically for that purpose.

For the past 100 years, from a home base in Thurles, Co. Tipperary, where the Irish Province of the Pallottines was established in 1909, over one hundred and fifty Irish Pallottine Priests & Brothers have brought the Word of God around the world and provided services and training in mission stations and parishes in the United States, England, Argentina, Africa and in Rome.

The Irish Pallottines have been particularly involved in East Africa, in Kenya and in Tanzania, among some of the poorest people on the African continent. The faith and inspiration they brought to those countries since they first went there in 1941 continues today with over 40 Kenyan and Tanzanian Priests and Students carrying on the good work.

The many people all over Ireland who have supported our work over the past Century can be proud of what has been achieved to-date – but we still need your help to continue this work.

To assist the Irish Pallottines in Africa and the growing young community of native African Pallottines, we seek to raise €500,000 over the next three years to finance our ongoing development projects – many of which are listed in the brochure – in East Africa.
