Missionary Testimony

Fr Martin Mareja SAC

Fr. Tommy Ryan, SAC was ordained a priest in 1974 in Ireland, and has been working in East Africa since 1985. He is the founder of the Siuyu Rehabilitation Centre in Siuyu, Singida Diocese, Tanzania.

He runs the Siuyu Rehabilitation Centre together with Sister Rosemary Ombay, SAC, of the Pallottine Missionary Sisters, and with other Sisters of the Province in East Africa.

They work together with a very committed group of lay people from the Union of Catholic Apostolate. His testimony helps us understand the breadth of this 'Everyone' to which both the Holy Founder refers in his apostolic insight and Pope Francis in his message for World Mission Day 2024.

The following article is from the message for Pallottine Mission Sunday, Rome 6th October 2024. Let these brief words from Fr Tommy engage you:

For almost 40 years I have been working in various areas in East Africa. In the last 30 years I have felt especially close to the people who are disabled, but it is only in the last 18 years that I have been devoted full time to those who are disabled. Usually, we view disability as something negative, but in some cases, it can be a blessing. This, without doubt, has been the case with me myself over the years.

Up to 30 years ago I was walking without a stick. Then with one stick, later with two, and after a number of years with a walking aid, and now I use a wheelchair. But I have no aches or pains so I can't complain. My diagnosis is a weakness in the legs which comes from a nervous system disorder. Living in a Centre with some children who use wheelchairs and have

no hope of ever walking, and seeing how happy they are, who am I to complain? And while I am in the final stages of life here on earth, they are at the beginning.

The Siuyu Rehabilitation Centre is for children of primary school age who are disabled, run by the U.A.C. (Pallottine Family). There are usually between 35 and 40 children of whom about 85% have intellectual impairment. For some it is mild, some medium, some more severe. At present there are six children here who have a physical impairment only and they study in mainstream classes in the government primary school in the local area. All the other children here in the Centre go to the local primary school each day, but to special classes and with special teachers.

Such children must be included in our society and must feel included. They are those of whom Pope Francis talks about when he says we must be ready to include all. They have much to offer the Community. God did not create useless persons. When Jesus took the little children in his arms and blessed them, maybe one or more were intellectually impaired or physically handicapped?

Living with such children is a real blessing, and I feel indeed blessed!


